

George Rushgrove - descendants

Updated – August 2019

There are branches of the family in England, Wales, USA, and Australia. All present day Rushgroves are descended from the children of Joseph Rushgrove (1788-1852) and Hannah Walker (1792-1857) who were Nail makers and lived in the small town of Kington in Herefordshire where most of their children were born; George, Hannah, Joseph, Abraham, Edmund, and John.

This document covers the descendants for their eldest son George (1812-1900)

Only limited information is given for those born after 1920. Most of the data is from public sources.

1. George Rushgrove (1812-1900) & children

George Rusgrove (1812-1900). Also Rusgrove. The son of Joseph Rushgrove and Hannah Walker. He was born in 1812 and baptised in Clent on the 25th December 1812; registered at Rowley Regis near Smethwick in 1813.^{1 2}

George married Eliza Thomas (1813-1852) at Lyonshall, Herefordshire on the 11th February 1839. Her father was John Thomas.³ Registered at Presteigne in the March quarter.⁴ This was reported in the local paper.⁵

Marriages

On Monday, at Lyonshall, in this county, by the Rev. J. Randall, Vicar, Mr. George Rushgrove, eldest son of Mr. Joseph Rushgrove, formerly of Oldswinford, Worcestershire, to Eliza, second daughter of Mr. J. Thomas, of Woolpits Radnorshire.

At the 1841 census they were living in Kington.⁶

Eliza died in Ludlow; registered in the September quarter 1852.⁸

George was married a second time to Elizabeth Miles (1821-1881) in Kington on the 28th March 1853; registered at Presteign in the March quarter.⁹ He was described as, of full age, Widower, Nailer, resident: Duke Street. His father was 'John Rushgrove', Nailer. Elizabeth was described as, of full age, Widow, resident Duke Street, father: John Davies, shoemaker. The witnesses were Edward Higgs and Elizabeth Hull.¹⁰

'John Rushgrove' is probably an error.

George was involved in a court case in November 1853.¹¹

District Petty Sessions

John Williams and George Rushgrove appeared to answer an information laid against them for being in pursuit of rabbits on the Sheet Manor, belonging to Richd. Wood, Esq. Edward Clayton, servant to Mr. Wood, stated that on Sunday the 14th instant, he was near Tinker's Hill, and saw Rushgrove, Williams, and one James Jones, standing at the mouth of a rabbit hole, or rather a fox's burrow, for one of the defendants crept in, and as he would not come out, witness struck him across the legs with a stick, and afterwards pulled him out; the defendants had dogs with them, and a ferret afterwards came out of the hole; both the defendants belonged to the town, and were represented as having obtained some notoriety as poachers. Rushgrove denied the charge, and stated that he had gone out and met with three young men to whom the dogs belonged, but took no part in the affair. Williams made a very similar defence. Fined, costs included in each case, 1l., which sums were shortly afterwards paid.

George Rushgrove and John Williams, both of Ludlow, were charged with being in pursuit of rabbits on the Sheet estate, the property of Richard Wood Esq. Fined, including costs, £1 each; the money was paid.

Their daughter Harriet was living at the same address but as a separate household.

Elizabeth died, aged 61; registered at Barton Regis (Bristol) in the September quarter 1881.¹⁵

George died, age 87, on the 8th May 1900 at 28 Mount Street, Welshpool; registered at Forden in the June quarter.¹⁷ His occupation is given as a 'retired Nailmaker/Journeyman'. The cause of death was 'Senile Decay' and the informant was his son George who was present at his death.^{18 19} 28 Mount Street was the home of his son George.

This was reported in a local paper.²⁰

George was buried at Welshpool on the 10th May 1900.²¹

George had five children with Eliza and three children with Elizabeth.

John Rusgrove (bd.1840). The son of George and Eliza Thomas. He was christened in Kington on the 12th May 1840.²² He died as an infant the same year; registered in Presteign in the September quarter 1840.²³

Elizabeth Rusgrove (bd.1841). Elizabeth Fanny. The daughter of George and Eliza Thomas. She was christened on the 5th September 1841 in Kington.²⁴ She died only a few months old; registered in the December quarter 1841 in Presteign.²⁵

Caroline Rusgrove (b.1844). Also Rushgrove. The daughter of George and Eliza Thomas. She was born in 1844; registered at Ludlow in the March quarter.²⁶

At the 1851 census, age 7, she was living at home in Lower Galdeford, Ludlow.

At the 1861 census, age 20?, she was living in Shrewsbury.²⁷

Caroline married John Reynolds in Ludlow on the 6th April 1862; registered at Ludlow in the June quarter. She was resident in Ludlow and her father was George Rushgrove. He was also resident in Ludlow and his father was Thomas Reynolds.^{28 29 30}

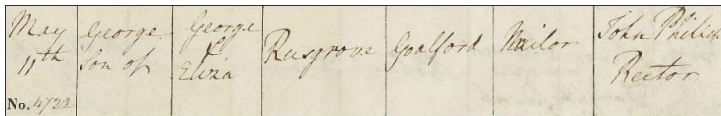
Their child Elizabeth died in Queensland Australia on 5th July 1955. Married name: Reid.³²

Abraham Rusgrove (1848-1852). The son of George and Eliza Thomas. He was born in Ludlow in 1848.

At the 1851, census, age 3, he was at home in Ludlow.

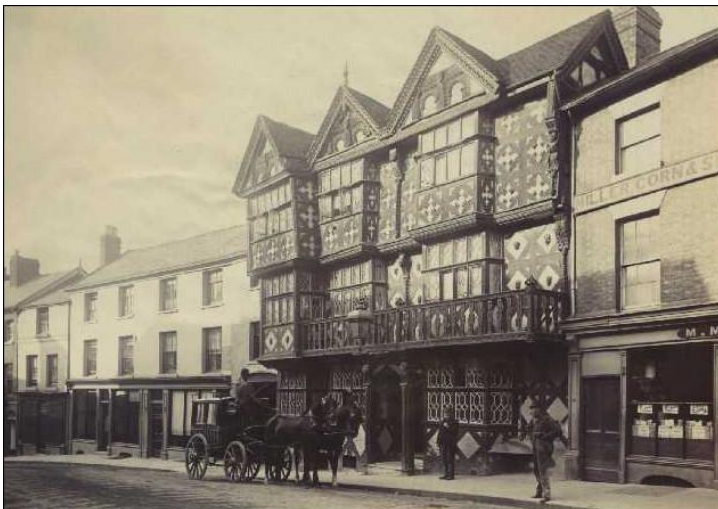
Abraham died in 1852, age 4, registered at Ludlow in the June quarter.³³

George Rusgrove (1846-1925). Also Rushgrove. The son of George and Eliza Thomas. He was born in Ludlow on the 11th May 1846; registered at Ludlow in the June quarter.^{34 35}

At the 1851 census, age 4, he was living at home in Lower Galdeford, Ludlow. Lower Galdeford is a street running into the centre of Ludlow from the East.

George married Ellen (Eleanor) Morris (1848-1899) on the 18th February 1867 in Ludlow; registered in Ludlow in the March quarter.^{37 38}. He was described as, age 20, bachelor, Labourer, Resident: Old Street. His father was George Rushgrove, Nailer. Ellen was described as, age 19, Spinster, servant, Resident: Old Street. Her father was Thomas Morris, Mason.³⁹ The witnesses were John Reynolds and John Evans.

John Reynolds was probably the husband of George's sister Caroline.

George was involved in a court case in 1868.⁴⁰

Welshpool – Stabbing to the heart

Louisa Davies, residing at the Upper Plantation, was charged by George Rushgrove with using threats whereby his life was in danger. The evidence went to show that Mr. Rushgrove overheard Mrs. Davies say that if George Rushgrove came down the street she would put a knife into his heart so far as it would go. In summing up Mr. Robinson Jones said Mrs. Davies was not only a woman but a very violent woman and when she was overheard to say what she did, he did not wonder that even a strapping fellow like Rushgrove felt a little alarmed. She must really restrain her temper, and her husband must be bound over for her good conduct. Mr. E.M. Jones and Mr. Hancock appeared in the case.

When his son George was born in 1869, George was described as a Labourer.

When his daughter Sarah was married in 1888 George was described as a Mason's labourer.

Eleanor died, aged 51, on the 25th June 1899; registered at Forden in the June quarter. The cause of death was 'Capillary Bronchitis exhaustion'. The informant was George Rushgrove.^{44 45}

She was buried in Welshpool on the 27th June 1899.⁴⁶

At the 1901 census George, age 54, was living at 28 Mount Street, Welshpool also living there were his son John and his wife Margaret and their daughter Dora. George was still working as a Brick maker.⁴⁷

At the 1911 census, age 64, George was living with his son John and his family at 28 Mount Street.

George is mentioned in Army records of 1913; when his son Albert enlisted.⁴⁸

George died on the 29th October 1925 at 28 Mount Street, Welshpool, aged 79. At his death his occupation was given as General labourer and the cause of death was 'Enlarged prostate and cystitis'. His son John was the informant and was also living at the same address. A memorial card read as follows.⁴⁹

In loving memory of George Rushgrove, 28 Mount Street, Welshpool. Who died Oct, 29th 1925, Aged 79 years, and was interred in Christ Churchyard, Oct 31st

George was buried at Welshpool on the 31st October 1927.⁵⁰

George and Eleanor had eleven children (see later section).

Harriet Rushgrove (b.1857). Harriet Jane. Also Rusgrove. The daughter of George and Elizabeth Miles. She was born in Kington in 1857; registered at Presteigne in the December quarter.⁵¹

At the 1861 census, age 5, she was at home in Welshpool.

Harriet was involved in a local show in 1869.⁵²

Another of those pleasant entertainments took place in the Primitive Methodist Chapel, yesterday evening week and there was again a crowded audience ... Miss Harriet Rushgrove, sung 'The Land of my Fathers'.

Harriet married William Rowland in 1879; registered at Barton Regis (Bristol), Gloucestershire in the June quarter.⁵³

Harriet may have married a second time to John Griffiths before 1901. At the 1901 census they were living in Manchester (see notes on Albert b.1890 below).

Abraham Rusgrove (bd.1860). Possibly the son of George and Elizabeth Miles. He was born in 1860; registered at Ludlow in the December quarter.⁵⁶ He died in the same quarter; registered at Ludlow.⁵⁷

Richard Rusgrove (d.1860). Possibly the son of George and Elizabeth Miles. He was buried at St. Lawrence Ludlow on the 27th December 1860; his death was registered in Ludlow in the December quarter 1860.^{58 59}

2. Descendants of George Rushgrove (1846-1925) & Eleanor Morris

George and Eleanor had eleven children and there are a large number of descendants.

2a. George Rusgrove (1869-1950) & Fanny Simester – descendants

George Rusgrove (1869-1950). The son of George and Eleanor. He was born at Upper Plantation, Welshpool on the 6th August 1869; registered at Montgomery in the September quarter.⁶⁰ He was baptised on the 29th August at Welshpool. His father was described as labourer.⁶¹

At the 1871 census, age 1, George was at home in Welshpool.

At the 1881 census, age 12, he was living at home at 10 Raven Square, Welshpool.

At the 1891 census, age 21, he was at home in Welshpool and working as a Brick maker

George married Fanny Simester (1871-1943) in 1894 at Tylerstown, Pontypridd; registered at Pontypridd in the September quarter.⁶²

Fanny was born in Welshpool and her father was William Simester At the 1881 census Fanny was living at home, age 10, at 17 Stanley Street, Welshpool and was described as a Scholar.

George and Fanny seem to have been living at 22 Stanley Street when it was sold as part of a lot in May 1900.⁶³

The present tenants are John Corbett, Charles Roberts, Francis Jones, George Rushgrove, and Edwin Ricketts, and the aggregate rents are £36 8s. N.B. Lots 3, 4, and 5 will first be offered as a whole, and if not sold, then in Three Lots as above. These Lots form a compact block with good frontages to the three streets mentioned; in addition to the present tenements there is a large Piece of Ground and a great quantity of Materials available for building purposes.

George appeared in court in August 1900.⁶⁴

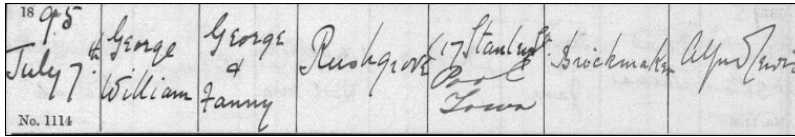
Fanny died, age 72, on the 1st August 1943 at 14 Stanley Street, Welshpool; registered at Welshpool in the September quarter. Probate was granted to her husband George and Eleanor Hardwicke her daughter on the 30th October 1943 at Llandudno. Her effects were valued at £450 2s 11d. George was described as a Sanitary authorities foreman.^{69 70}

Fanny was buried at Welshpool on the 4th August.⁷¹

George died, aged 80, in 1950; registered at Welshpool in the June quarter 1950.⁷² His abode was 'Brynock'. He was buried at Welshpool on the 20th May.⁷³

George and Fanny had four children; George Rusgrove (1895-1960), Eleanor Rusgrove (1900-1988), Elizabeth Rusgrove (b.1897), Herbert (1904-1934).

George Rushgrove (1895-1960). George William. The son of George and Fanny. He was born in Welshpool in 1895; registered at Forden in the September quarter.⁷⁴ He was baptised at Welshpool on the 7th July. The family were living at 17 Stanley Street, Welshpool. His father was described as a Brickmaker.⁷⁵

At the 1911 census, age 15, George was living at home in Welshpool and working as a Plumber's apprentice.

George joined the Royal Welsh Fusiliers in 1914, in World War I. He was a private. His regimental number was 3614. He was awarded the British War Medal and Victory medal and also the 1914-15 Star; which indicates that he served overseas.⁷⁶

George married Sarah Elizabeth Maud Turner (1896-1994) in August 1919 at Welshpool; registered at Forden in the September quarter.⁷⁷ Her father was David Jim Turner (b.1875) and her mother was Sarah Jane Reese (b.1872). George was living at 14 Stanley Street and working as a Plumber, Sarah was living at Spring Bank, Welshpool. The witnesses were: Elinor Rushgrove, William Castle?, David Turner, Dawn? Winifred Turner.⁷⁸

At the 1939 register they were living at Welshpool.⁷⁹

In 1943 George (with his sister Eleanor) dealt with probate after the death of their father George.

George received the British Empire Medal in 1959.⁸⁰ He was a sub-officer with the Denbighshire and Montgomeryshire Fire Brigade.

George died, age 65, in 1960; registered at Welshpool in the December quarter.⁸¹ His residence, at the time, was 14 St. Mary's Place, Welshpool. He was buried at Welshpool on the 5th November.⁸²

Probate was granted to his widow Sarah in 1960.⁸³

Rushgrove George William of 14 St. Marys Place, Welshpool, Montgomery died 2 November 1960 at Victoria Memorial Hospital, Welshpool. Probate London. 28 April to Sarah Elizabeth Maud Rushgrove, widow. Effect £1,249 15s. 5d.

Sarah died, age 97, in 1994; registered in January.⁸⁴ Her abode at the time was 14 St. Mary's Place, Welshpool. She was buried at Welshpool on the 3rd February.⁸⁵

George and Sarah had a son George.

George Rushgrove (b.1925). George D R. The son of George and Sarah. He was born in 1925; registered at Forden in the September quarter.⁸⁶

Four boys, William Blythe, John Rushgrove, Chas., Gamble, and Evan Parry, were brought up on a charge of stealing lead, but D.C.C. Crowden (who was present) asked that the case might be withdrawn or dismissed as the police had failed to find the owner of the lead.

The Mayor in dismissing the case, said the defendants had had a very narrow escape and he hoped it would be a warning to them as long as they lived.

John married Margaret Kate Davies (1878-1935) on the 23rd December 1899; registered at Welshpool.^{111 112} He was described as, age 22, Bachelor, Labourer, resident at 28 Mount Street. His father was George Rushgrove a Labourer. Margaret was described as, age 20, a spinster, resident at 28 Mount Street. Her father was George Davies a Tin Plate worker. The witnesses were: John Williams and Martha Harris.

Nelson was involved in a serious motor accident on the 13th April 1926.¹²¹

A collision in which three motor-cycles were involved occurred on the main road between Newtown and Caersws late on Sunday night, and resulted in the death of Mr. Wilfred TALBOT, corn merchant, of Cilfyndd, Pontypridd, and injuries to his pillion rider, Mr. F.H. EVANS, of 28, Market-street, Trehafod, Pontypridd, who now lies in a somewhat serious condition in the Montgomeryshire Infirmary at Newtown.

Mr. TALBOT and his friends were motor-cycling home from Welshpool, when there was a crash

with two other machines, one driven by a Mr. RUSHGROVE, of Welshpool, with Miss RUSHGROVE pillion-riding, and the other driven by Mr. Tom EVANS, of Welshpool, who had Mr. Nelson SLADDIN, of The Crescent, Ashton-under-Lyne, on the pillion. The district coroner opened an inquest on Monday but it was adjourned until the 30th inst.

Dora died, age 25, on the 6th August 1926.¹²² A memorial card read:-

In loving memory of Dora, the beloved wife of Nelson Sladdin, 104 Curzon Road, Ashton-under-Lyne who died August 6th 1926, aged 25 years. Interred in Christ Churchyard Welshpool.

Dora was buried in Welshpool on the 10th August.¹²³

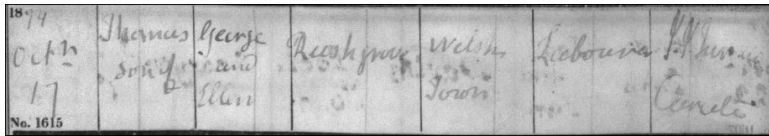

Thomas, age 15, was involved in another court case in November 1898.¹⁶²

Robbery at the Railway Station – A serious charge.

P.S. Pryce charged Wm D Jones, 20, Mount Street (14), John Charles Jones, 20 Mount Street (12), Frederick Waring, 2 Mount Street (9), Richard Evans, Mount Street (10), and Edward Edwards, Raven Street (10), with breaking into the refreshment room on the down platform of Welshpool Railway Station on Sunday last, and stealing therefrom several packets of cigaretttes, sweets, etc. valued at 11s 6d. Thomas Rushgrove, Mount Street (15), was also charged with receiving the stolen property. Before the hearing of the evidence, P.S. Pryce asked the Bench to discharge one of the boys as he wished him to give evidence against the other lads. The boy was accordingly discharged. Florence Lewis, in charge of the small refreshment room on the down platform, stated that on Sunday at about 7.20 a.m. she closed the bar and locked the door of the room. Returning at 9.10 p.m. she found the window of the room open, and everything inside in confusion. Cigars and cigarettes were scattered about the floor, and also an iron bar, which had evidently been used to prise open the window. There were about two dozen chocolates gone, and four sixpenny boxes and a dozen threepenny packets of cigarettes. Some whisky and brandy was also missing. P.S. Pryce here produced some of the articles found on the boys which were identified by the witness. Continuing, she said she at once reported what had taken place to the manageress of the rooms on the up-platform, Miss Amy Roberts, and P.S. Pryce was at once sent for. George Farnan, manager of the Refreshment Rooms for Messrs Spiers and Pond, stated that about 9.20 on Sunday night he was summoned to the Railway Station, and on arriving there he found that the window of the small bar had been wrenched up and that articles to the value of 11s 6d had been stolen. The window was a perfectly secure one. He then gave Sergeant Pryce articles similar to those stolen, in order that the stolen property might be more easily identified. Richard Evans, the boy discharged, said that on Sunday afternoon Edward Edwards asked him to go with him to the refreshment room at the Station to get some chocolate. Frederick Waring accompanied them. Edwards secured the iron bar to open the window. Edwards and himself went into the refreshment room and got some cigarettes whilst Waring stopped outside to watch. About seven

o'clock he met Charles Jones, William Jones, Edward Edwards, and Waring coming from the refreshment room. They said they had got some cigarettes and gave some of them to Rushgrove. P.C. Rees Williams said that at about 7.30 p.m. on Sunday, he was on duty in Broad Street, and saw a number of boys standing under the lamps by New Street. He walked towards them and saw that they had a quantity of cigarettes in the possession. On seeing him the boys ran off. P.S. Pryce stated that on Sunday night, about 9.30, he was summoned to the Railway Station. He found the refreshment room broken open and was told that quantity of tobacco and sweets had been stolen. He afterwards made enquiries and on Monday arrested the defendants, finding tobacco in the possession of Rushgrove and Evans. The Bench retired, and on their return the Mayor said that the found defendants W.D. Jones, Frederick Waring, J. Charles Jones, and Edward Edwards had been found guilty of stealing from the refreshment room and that they also considered the charges against Thos. Rushgrove of receiving the stolen property as being proved. Frederick Waring and Edward Edwards would receive 12 strokes with the birch rod inasmuch as the evidence proved they went to the refreshment room twice, and Charles Jones and William Jones 10. Rushgrove would be fined 7s 6d of seven days' imprisonment. Addressing the boys the Mayor said that they must understand what a serious offence it was, and if any of them came before the Magistrates again they would be compelled to send them to a reformatory. He hoped it would be a warning to them all. It was an exceedingly hard thing for him that the first magisterial duty he had to perform in his new capacity was to sentence boys. He would much rather have the pleasure of discharging them. The prisoners cried bitterly.

Gaming and obstruction, played with money a game called 'pitch and toss' near the Armoury, in Brook street, at 7.30 p.m. on Monday, the 1st inst. Defendants admitted the offence, and were each fined 1s, to include cost. The Mayor, in cautioning the youths, mentioned that he had heard many complaints about the playing of this game, especially on Sundays. He therefore advised defendants to be careful. If they came before them again they would be dealt with more severely.

His father was George Rushgrove. Labourer. Elizabeth was described as, age 34 years, Widow, Resident: Leadgate. Her father was Joseph Brittain (deceased), Labourer. The witnesses were: William Bell and Margaret Ann Bell.¹⁶⁷

Elizabeth was a widow and was previously married to William Beard, a Railway worker; they had four or five children. Thomas and William knew each other and worked together on the Railways.

In 1920 and 1921 they were living in Consett.¹⁶⁸

Eleanor married Julian Harvey Cole in 1945; registered at Exmoor in the December quarter.¹⁹⁷
Eleanor died, age 74, in 1993.¹⁹⁸

Eleanor and Julian had an adopted daughter Brenda Cole.

Albert Rushgrove (1890-1974). The son of George and Eleanor. He was born in Welshpool on the 8th December 1890; registered at Forden in the December quarter.¹⁹⁹ He was baptised at Welshpool on the 24th December. The family were living at Pool Town. His father was described as a Labourer.²⁰⁰

At the 1901 census, age 6 months, Albert was living with his Uncle and Aunt, John and Jane Griffiths.²⁰¹

Albert's elder brother Thomas (1872-1874) died at Ardwick, Manchester and his sister Nellie was working in Manchester. Jane Griffiths was Albert's Aunt: Harriet Jane Rushgrove and this was her second marriage.

Albert joined the Monmouthshire Regiment, originally as a Territorial, on the 25th April 1913.^{202 203}

He became a full time soldier (was embodied), in the early stages of World War I, on the 5th August 1914. He served with the 3rd Battalion.

He was with the Battalion in France from February to April 1915 (possibly around Ypres).

The Battalion was posted to France (near the Somme) on the 4th August 1915. Albert was seriously wounded in action on the 4th February 1916, possibly during preparatory actions before the Battle of the Somme which was due to start on 1st July 1916; the Battalion was near Amiens in France on the 4th February.

This is Albert's description of the action.

Wounded through right lung first time on Active service in France. Second time in France bronchitis set in after being the Wet trenches and I have been having treatment of Dr. Smith and my chest was too bad for me to follow my Employment as a Collier and I am now doing light work at the Colliery. (Whitworth Colliery Tredegar).

Albert was posted back home from the 5th February 1916 and transferred to the reserve on the 31st October 1916. It looks as though he never fully recovered from his wounds and complications as he was discharged as not fit for military service on 14th November 1917.

Albert's reference from the Army was as follows:-

Albert married Catherine Gallavin (1894-1983) at Crickhowell in the March quarter 1917.²⁰⁵ In 1918 they were living in Tredegar and later moved to Welshpool.

At the 1939 register they were living in Tredegar.²⁰⁶

Albert Rushgrove (1918-1973). Albert George. Known as Jim. The son of Albert and Catherine. He was born in Tredegar, Wales, on the 25th March 1918; registered at Bedwelty in the June quarter.²⁰⁹

Albert married Mary Ryan in 1946; registered at Bradford in the March quarter.²¹⁰

Mary's parents were Mary Ryan (b.1897) and Timothy Ryan (b.1895), not related, who were married in about 1923 in Bradford, Yorkshire. The Ryan family on Mary's mother's side came from Ireland originally.

It is possibly Albert who was recalled in the autobiography of Peter Moss, writing about India around 1947.

Leading Aircraftman Jimmy Rushgrove, who had become a favourite with the family and a more frequent visitor than any of the other servicemen within our expanded social circle, was very encouraging of my budding artistic talents, and offered much useful advice. A native of Wigan in Lancashire, young Jimmy was as short and sad faced as a basset hound. When the monsoon broke, he stood wide-eyed on the verandah, watching the water level visibly rise across our flooded lawns. "Eee, it's fair chuckin' it down," he murmured.

Albert died, age 55, on the 28th August 1973, at Fagley, Bradford; registered at Bradford in the September quarter.²¹¹

Albert and Mary had three children: Brian A (b.1947), Patrick J (b.1948), Teresa E (b.1957).^{212 213 214}

Eileen Rushgrove (b.1920). The daughter of Albert and Catherine. She was born in 1920; registered at Bedwellty in the June quarter.²¹⁵

She married Kenneth C Stephens in 1946; registered at Bedwellty in the September quarter.²¹⁶

Winifred Rushgrove (b.1922). Known as Winnie. The daughter of Albert and Catherine. She was born in 1922; registered at Bedwellty in the December quarter.²¹⁷

She married Kenneth B Moore in 1943; registered at Bedwellty in the June quarter.²¹⁸

Winifred served in the RAF probably during the Second World War.²¹⁹

Winifred and Kenneth had two children; Terence K Moore (b.1947) and Wendy T Moore (b.1949).^{220 221}

Margaret Rushgrove (bd.1925). The daughter of Albert and Catherine. She was born in 1925; registered at Bedwellty in the December quarter.²²² She died in the same quarter.²²³

Elizabeth Rushgrove (b.1930). Elizabeth Margaret. The daughter of Albert and Catherine. She was born in 1930; registered at Bedwellty in the September quarter.²²⁴

Elizabeth served in the RAF, probably in the Second World War. ²²⁵

Elizabeth married I G P Pascoe in 1950; registered at Bedwellty in the September quarter.²²⁶

Elizabeth and Pascoe had seven children. William J (b.1951) Pascoe, Richard T Pascoe (b.1952), Elizabeth J Pascoe (b.1957), Catherine B Pascoe (b.1962), Angela M Pascoe (b.1963), Victoria Jayne Pascoe (b.1966), David Byron Pascoe (b.1968).^{227 228 229 230 231 232 233}

Mary Rushgrove (b.1936). Also Marie. The daughter of Albert and Catherine. She was born in 1936; registered at Bedwellty in the December quarter.²³⁴ She married Joshua B Williams in 1956; registered at Bedwellty.²³⁵

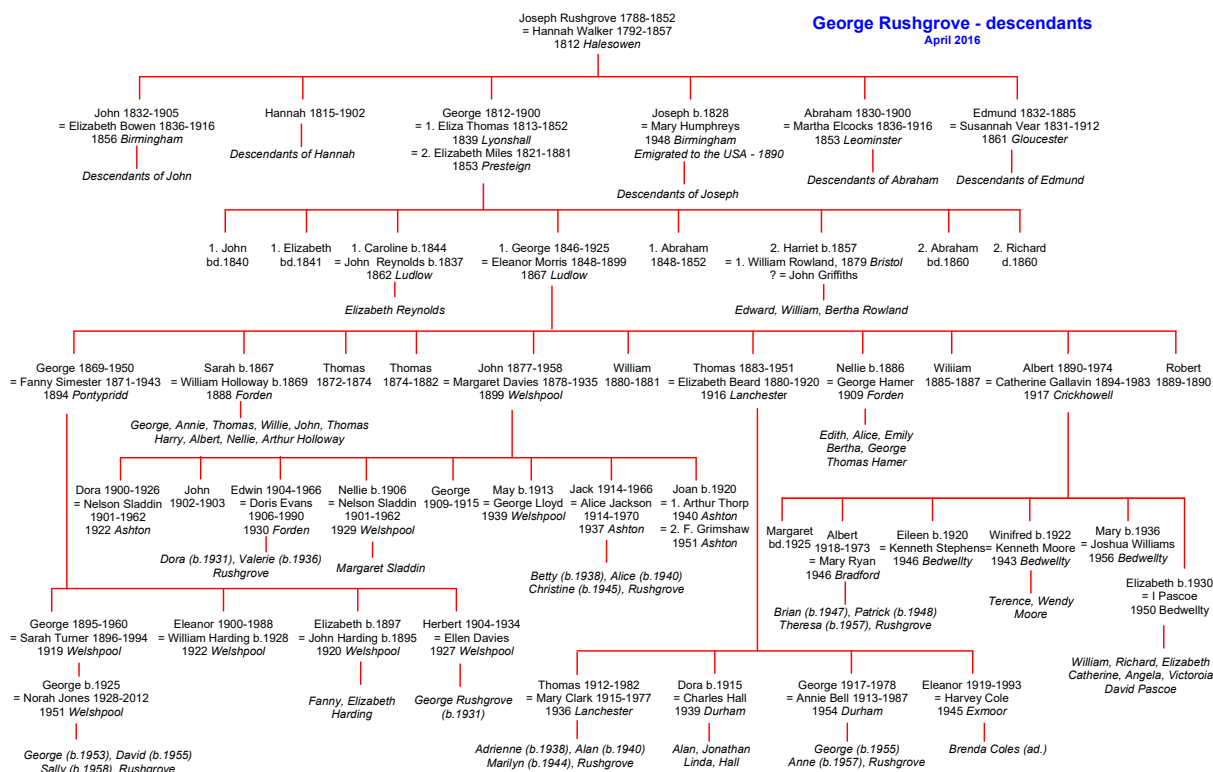
